From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Christ Lutheran family and all who read this article,

I greet you in the precious name of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! In this world, there can be time when we lose hope, and even forget the purpose of our salvation in Christ Jesus. I would like to share with you a message from the first letter of the apostle Peter which may help us and remind u the purpose of our new life in Christ.

The Living Hope

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time." 1 Peter 1:3-5

The apostle Peter opens his letter with words of praise for God the Father and His Son, Jesus Christ reminding readers that salvation is a aift of God's mercy. Then Peter states that believers are given "a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ."

Difficult times often make us lose hope. Being hopeless, we are unable to see the possibility of better days. Life can at times be tough, whether due to financial struggles, health issues, relationship issues, loss or emotional hardships. During such tough phases, we may find ourselves overthinking and feeling stuck.

It's important to remember that no matter how difficult things may seem, they will eventually improve. By holding onto even the little candle of hope, we can find our way through. By maintaining faith, trusting the process, and believing in a positive outcome can help us endure even the toughest situations.

Peter states that it is the "new birth" that provides our living hope, affirming that salvation is a gift from God. Just as an infant does nothing to be born, we experience rebirth not because of who we are or anything we have done. We are born of God (John1:13) through Jesus' resurrection from the dead. Salvation changes who we are (2 Corinthians 5:17) making us dead to sin and alive to righteousness in Jesus Christ (Ephesians 2:5). This new birth serves as our reason for hope – the assurance of Salvation.

The apostle is speaking to Christians who were suffering persecution in Asia Minor. His words were meant to encourage them in their troubles.

The Daily Bread Food Pantry

Praise God in all seasons of your life for He always remains the same! This is an expression shared with several pantry visitors during the July distribution. Various unexpected or unplanned surprises have come up for many people from health, employment challenges, retirement, disability to basic survival issues. The rise in cost of living has impacted local families and individuals, uncertain of where their next meal will come from.

The Daily Bread Food Pantry reached out to thirty-three households (80 individuals) in July. A church member volunteered to use the Thrivent Generosity program to donate towards this ministry. It provided \$250 worth of paper products, like toilet paper, paper towels, and boxes of Kleenex for the Pantry. This was very helpful and appreciated, as it also helps stretch the pantry budget expenses.

The upcoming pantry distribution is scheduled for Tuesday, September 16, between noon and 1:00 p.m. There is a need for laundry detergent, liquid dish soap, kleenex boxes, garbage bags, bars of soap, or toothpaste. The 2025 May Stamp Out Hunger non-perishable foods are shared and well accepted by visitors. There are labeled boxes for pantry donations in the education unit below the coat racks. Thank you to everyone who contributed their time and generosity!

Living hope is anchored in the past---Jesus rose from the dead (Mt 28:6). It continues in the present-Jesus is alive (Col 3:1). And it endures throughout the future—Jesus promises eternal, resurrection life (JN 3:16, 4:14, 5:24, Ro 6:22). The believer's living hope is solid and secure: "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure." Let us challenge ourselves with these words of the Lord to renew our spirit for better service and life. May the Almighty bless you richly!

Open Positions

- (1) Treasurer: Officer of the congregation, member of the Executive Committee, Church Council, and custodian of all church funds, except the CLC Foundation. Manage all disbursements and receipts, prepare for the annual audit and annual church meeting, plus make financial recommendations to the Council.
- (1) **Recording Secretary:** Record monthly minutes and distribute them to the office, Pastor, Council members, and post in the Narthex.
- (1) **Finance:** Monitor the financial health of the congregation. Oversee the CLC Foundation and the offering counters.
- (1) **Worship:** Assist Evelyn Hudson-Wright (Chairperson) in coordinating the combined efforts of altar guild, ushers, music, lesson readers, worship assistants, communion servers and screen team for each worship service.


