From the Pastor's desk

Dear families of Christ Lutheran Church.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all!

Happy New Year to all of you! This new year reminds me again about the unceasing mercy of God which is abundant for all who believe in HIM. This time I would like to share a comforting word from the book of Isaiah 40:27-31, which God put in my heart for this New Year. Here is the Word:

Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, "My way is hidden from the LORD, and my right is disregarded by my God"? Have you not known? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth.

He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and to him who has no might he increases strength. Even youths shall faint and be weary, and young men shall fall exhausted; but they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.

According to the Old Testament theologians, the book of Isaiah is divided into three parts. The first part is called **Proto-Isaiah**, the second is called **Deutero-Isaiah** and the third is called **Trito-Isaiah**. This text tells us the three-fold fundamental things about the God, whom we serve and worship.

1) GOD IS AWARE!

To a people tempted to be impatient, forgetful and of little faith, Isaiah said: why do you say, "My way is hidden from the Lord, and my just claim is passed over by my God?" Why do you think that way? Why make such a reckless charge? "Have you not known? Have you not heard? The everlasting God, the Lord, the Creator of the ends of the earth, neither faints nor is weary. There is no searching of His understanding."

God is aware! He is aware of that which challenges His people from day to day. We may be surrounded by all manner of unsympathizing hostility. And we may find ourselves tempted to stop trusting the Lord whom we worship and follow. We may be forced to think, "God has forgotten me...He has passed me by!" But whatever our inadequate emotions and reactions may tell us, GOD IS THERE, AND AWARE. "The Lord knows the way of the righteous," (Psa. 1:6)

It doesn't matter though you are passing through a dangerous zone, though you are lonely and seem to be helpless, God is aware of everything. Nothing is hidden before him. You may experience his intervention any time.

As those Jews went through the dark moments of their Captivity in Babylon and when we go through our times of difficulties, pain and frustration, we need to have our remembrance moved and our conscience pricked. Our way is not hidden from the Lord! God is aware.

2) God is able

In the spiritual world, it is very vital not to put ourselves as a forerunner in any situation. God is our Shepherd who always goes before us. It doesn't matter how big our enemy is! It doesn't matter how big our challenges are; we need to see our God who is bigger than our enemies and challenges. Yes, we are not able but HE IS ABLE. Nothing is impossible for God. He is an almighty God, who is able to do abundantly and exceedingly above what we ask and think.

3 God is available

He is available, to renew the strength of "those who wait" on Him. One might inquire, "what does it mean, to wait on him?" Let us understand that this is not a passive thing, where you do nothing, and ask for everything, then wait for it to be handed to you. That's not waiting for God. NO! That's pleading with Satan to devour, and take advantage. To wait on God means SINCERE AND STEADY DEPENDENCE ON HIM, WITH OBEDIENT TRUST – and no misgivings about His faithfulness, in doing what He says...nor about our need to obey Him.

It means, there is only one place you can find the healing you seek. The wounds of suffering, and grief and death can reach deep into the soul. And it may seem like a tremendous burden, at the moment. But if you have a Biblical understanding of the everlasting God, you can find the healing you seek. Therefore, let us keep in mind these three comforting words of the prophet Isaiah: God is aware, God is able and God is available.

The Means of Grace

The preaching, teaching and very life of the Lutheran Church centers around the Word of God, specifically the Means of Grace. In this regard, the Lutheran confessions are very clear:

"Therefore, we ought and must constantly maintain this point, that God does not wish to deal with us otherwise than through the spoken Word and the Sacraments. It is the devil himself whatsoever is extoled as Spirit without the Word and the Sacraments." (Smalcald Articles Part 111, Art. VIII, 10)

According to definition we find in the small catechism, the Means of Grace: "...are meant those things by which God offers and gives His gifts of forgiveness, of sins, life, and salvation." Luther's small catechism (Gausewitz edition, 1956, p 191).

According to the Lutheran heritage we have two means of grace:

- 1. The Word of God
- 2. The Sacraments (Holy Baptism and Holy Communion)

One of the most important parts of the Reformation is what Dr.Martin Luther quoted as "Sola scriptura", which means "the scripture alone" in Latin. Any theology that denies the Means of Grace, or which diminishes the Means of Grace is neither Scriptural or Lutheran. The Reformation was based on fundamental elements which we as Lutherans pay attention to. The Word of God is the Manual we can use as a reference for any failure or confusion. It helps us to come back to the right path.

NALC Disaster Response Needs Your Help!

North American Lutheran Church congregations throughout the US have come to the aid of people suffering from a variety of natural disasters. From the wildfires in California to the hurricanes in Florida, the response of NALC congregations has supported those affected by these disasters and are preparing to help others who might fall victim in future situations.

The NALC has nine Regional Disaster Response Warehouses. Disaster Response receives **no** financial support from the NALC. One hundred percent of the funding comes from offerings and donations. These warehouses are stocked with flood buckets, health kits, quilts and blankets to respond with help when disasters happen.

Our Michigan Mission Warehouse is in Owosso and needs to be restocked. The manager of the Owosso Warehouse has requested our help. The Evangelism Committee has selected Health Care Kits to help supply the warehouse. For a list of the items see page 8. They are also requesting new or used Bibles. These items are not expected to last for years or even months; so they don't have to be top-shelf quality.

Please consider helping with this project. We are suggesting you provide complete kits, if possible. partner with someone to provide a kit, if you wish.

This week, I purchased these items from Walmart and Dollar Tree. The items for the kit cost between \$14 and \$16 depending on if you buy travel size and need 2 of the same item. I used the dental floss my dentist gave me. You could use the toothbrush from your dentist as well. I also bought a 12 pack of combs for \$1.25 from the Dollar Store. Just make sure the toothbrushes are individually wrapped. There are extra items on a table in the hallway outside of Pastor's office. Please take them for your kit.

The Disaster Response Team suggests packing the items in a 2 gallon Ziplock bag, or a drawstring tote bag. We will be collecting these kits through February 26. Place your finished kits on the table in the hallway. If you have any questions, please see me.
