From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

Greetings to you from our redeemer and the apostle of our faith, Jesus Christ our Lord!

Some of you are still away on vacation or for a family visit and I hope you are enjoying this wonderful summer weather. Wherever you are, you are in our prayers.

What Jesus said in *Matthew 11:28-30* is still fresh in my spirit after I preached on the text last time. Jesus said,

"Come to me, all who are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

This invitation is inclusive without exception. Jesus is willing to take away our burden. In this world, there is too much burden for us to struggle with, but thank God that His grace is abundant for all who want to rely on His promises.

From the President

Hello fellow members in Christ! I hope you are enjoying the wonderful summer weather we are having. Yes, it's finally arrived. With the improving weather we also have a greater opportunity to socialize and get to know our church family better. We should use this as a reminder to renew our faith in Christ as He is with us through all of life's sunshine, rain, and drought in our lives. If you are experiencing sunshine in your life come and rejoice with song and prayer. If you are experiencing some rain, come for prayer and support by Pastor and fellow members. If you have experienced a spiritual drought, continue to pray, and look to the Lord for guidance and strength. Request an appointment for counselling with Pastor Hunde. Come and join us, hear the Gospel and feel the Holy Spirit fill you with hope for daily living.

If you have been away, this is a great time to come back to church and see all you've been missing. Our 10 a.m. services will be held through September. They will be more of a "blended" style, incorporating both traditional and contemporary Praise Band music, even while we search for a Music Director. We miss you and are looking forward to your return.

On Sept. 24, during our Annual Congregational Meeting, we will be putting a motion on the floor to change our service time from 9 and 11 am to 10:00 am service on a permanent basis. We would like you to seriously consider this change. The basis for this change is simple. We noticed a serious attendance decline in both the 9 and 11am services. Since the beginning of the year, we have seldom had more than 50 members on average at either service, and occasionally we have had as few as 20 members in attendance. When we switched to 10 am services for either special occasions or during the summer, we noticed that we averaged an attendance in the 80's. It also is more cost and time effective to run one service. We will be heating and cooling from 9 am to 11:30 am instead of 8 am to 1 pm. We would only need a musician for one service instead of two, especially important since we are still in search of a Music Director. We have a very limited supply of musicians, even with the assistance of the praise bands. We would only need volunteers for Worship assistants, ushers, communion servers, and communion set up for one service. It also is personally and emotionally more fulfilling to preach, assist, and sing to a fuller church. Plus, combining worship services will only increase the camaraderie of members who rarely see one another due to the separate church service times.

I am aware that many have a favorite service and time they like to attend, and might find the time change not to their liking. We will work together to create a service to meet everyone's needs. So, please prayfully consider this change. There will be more reminders and temple talks to help you with your decision. Even though we usually return to two services after Rally Day in September, we will continue with the 10 am service through September 24 as a trial period when most members will be back from their vacations. This will give everyone a chance to attend. (continued on page 7)

Mammogram Screen Bus coming to CLC

God Creates the world with more birhdays because Mammograms save lives!

The Henry Ford 3D Mobile Mammogram Screen Bus is scheduled to offer breast/cervical cancer screenings in the CLC parking lot on Saturday, Aug. 26, from 9:30-2:30. An appointment is required with pre-registration.

Who is eligible? Women who are 40+ years old What is necessary to pre-register? A driver's license & proof of health insurance

How do I sign up? Applications are available on the credenza outside the business office.

Anyone who is uninsured or facing high out-of-pocket costs may be able to enroll in a program that offers free service. The two programs to apply for in advance are www.bcccp.org or call (888) 242-2702 and www.Michigan.gov/Cancer or (844) 446-8727. This needs to be completed and approved a week prior to making an appointment for your mammogram.

Breast cancer deaths in the USA have declined for more than a decade because of mammograms. Ms. Angela Rogensues of the Warren City Council emphasizes the importance for women to get screened for early detections. She is cancer-free and grateful for all the prayers, care, and support throughout her experience. For this reason, she contacted a Henry Ford medical team and requested that staff make this available at Christ Lutheran. If you know of someone who would benefit from this service, please encourage them to take advantage of this opportunity! Appointments will fill quickly. To pre-register, please contact the church office at (586) 293-0700 and leave your name and phone number for further information. Thank you.





Operation Christmas Child



Summer is marching on, and before we know it, November will be upon us. The Evangelism Committee would like to sponsor the Operation Christmas Child ministry again this year. We feel this is a wonderful Evangelistic outreach.

These shoe boxes will be delivered to children living in impoverished conditions all over the world. Along with the shoe box, the children receive a Gospel booklet written in their own language, with follow-up children's Bible study program. This will probably be the first time these children will be introduced to Jesus and His life-saving message. Then these children will go home and tell their family members and friends about Jesus too.

We will have pamphlets available outside the Church office that include suggestions and instructions for filling the shoe box (what to include, as well as what <u>not</u> to include), a tag you can use to label your shoe box, and an envelope to include the \$10 donation (check made out to <u>Samaritan's Purse</u>) to cove shipping expenses, printed materials, and other project expenses. We also have some pre-printed shoe boxes available for you to use or you can use your own shoe box. If you choose to wrap your shoe box, just be sure to wrap the box and lid separately, and secure it with a rubber band.

Shoe box collection is the third week of November, so you have all summer to select fun and useful items for your shoe box. Take children with you when you go shopping – they will have fun with you selecting as many things as they can fit in that box!
